Domestic abuse

Domestic abuse is when someone you know hurts or controls you – this can happen between

• partners or ex-partners



• or family members





Coercive control

When someone makes you feel scared, controls your money, or stops you from seeing friends and family



Financial abuse Taking or controlling your money



Psychological or emotional abuse Making you feel bad or scared



Physical abuse Hurting your body



Sexual abuse Forcing you to do sexual things



Online abuse Using technology to hurt you



Honour-based abuse

Hurting you to protect the reputation of your family or your community



Female genital mutilation (FGM) Cutting or hurting female private parts



Forced marriage

Making you marry someone you don't want to marry
